Introduction

Annual Report Overview

Prioritization

Essex County Health Partners (ECHP) carried out several steps to prioritize the health needs of the community, as detailed within the Community Health Assessment 2022 and Community Health Improvement Plan 2022-2024. The prioritization matrix criteria included categories of need and feasibility. Guiding questions were related to scope and

severity, the perceived ability to impact the problem, and community readiness to address identified health issues. An internal planning group of Essex County Health Partners reviewed and confirmed the data-informed priorities selected. Further prioritization input was requested, including from community members, to inform the corresponding 2022-2024 Community Health Improvement Plan/Community Service Plan. The following three priorities were selected from the 2019-2024 New York State Prevention Agenda:

Summary of Accomplishments

This annual report for calendar year 2024 details key actions taken to advance population health initiatives and community health priorities.

Highlights of 2024

- We have bolstered how we promote community health and wellness events. This has increased participation year over year
- Hosted **14 annual events**, detailed in the report.
- 235 families and 571 individuals were served by the food pantry operated out of the Crown Point Health Center, welcoming any community members who live in Essex County and/or receive care from ECH.
- 8,522 lbs of food were given out
- Wellness Rx supported 63 participants in 2024 with 72% total participants reducing their A1cand/or BMI.

Work Underway/Anticipated for 2025

- 2024 marked the last year of the current Community Service Plan. ECH and key partners are currently carrying out the CHA for Essex County and preparing for the release of the 2025-2030 NYS Prevention Agenda.
- ECH continues to schedule our community outreach events to provide free screenings for our community. To date we have plans for our annual heart health events in February. Quarterly blood drives with the Regional Blood Bank are scheduled while we investigate options to partner with the American Red Cross on future events. We will be promoting the free Cancer Service Programs in our primary care clinics all throughout the year to increase the opportunities for our patients. Additional outreach will be scheduled for the Summer and Fall months as well.

PREVENTATIVE CARE AND MANAGEMENT

Objectives:

- Reduce barriers related to cost and location of screening.
- Identify patients at risk for diabetes, high cholesterol or heart disease.

Strategies: offer free women's health screenings at accessible locations.

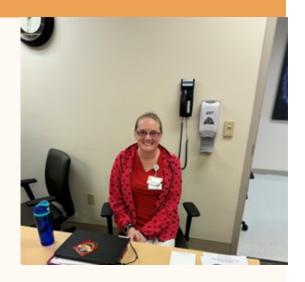
Summary: Breast Cancer screenings, mammograms, pap smears and A1c and lipid screening was provided free of cost to uninsured women at both the Elizabethtown and Ticonderoga hospitals.

Accomplishments to highlight:

Annual Women's Health event partnering with Cancer Services Program of Northeastern New York served10 participants. These services are grant funded.

GOAL: Enhance use of technology and Electronic Health Record (EHR) to improve access to care

Objectives: Scheduling simplification in EPIC EHR.

Strategies: UVMHN implemented a system-wide initiative addressing scheduling simplification. EPIC Scheduling was enhanced to improve access.

GOAL: Reduce the risk of chronic disease

Objectives: Identify patients at risk for diabetes, high cholesterol or heart disease.

Strategies:

 Advertising through network partners, at our health centers and campuses as well on social media.

Accomplishments to highlight:

- Hosted two annual Fall Health Screening Events offering free A1c and lipid blood draws as well as a free EKG. We invited community partners to participate and offer educational material to participants.
- Hosted two free annual Heart Health events in February with 69 community member participants.
- Hosted quarterly blood drives rotating between our two campuses. Partnered with Adirondack Regional Blood Bank with 47 participants.
- Hosted annual Mental Wellness Fair in May to increase awareness and access to care for those suffering with mental health issues.
- Hosted annual Wellness Fair at one of Essex counties largest employers each year, Sylvamo. Offer free A1c and lipid blood draws and free EKG to participants. 35 participants in 2024.
- Hosted two annual Diabetes Fairs in November, one in Elizabethtown and one in Ticonderoga.
 Participants received free A1c testing. Community partners were invited to participate and offer educational material to participants. 35 participants were served.

Objectives: Elizabethtown Community Hospital strives to treat the whole person. Food insecurity is a challenge many in our community face. By providing access to a healthy variety of foods, we hope to ease this burden for those we serve.

Strategies:

- Connected with local schools and other distribution centers to educate and advertise access to the pantry.
- Deliver food to any of our locations to increase access for those with transportation challenges.

Accomplishments to highlight:

- 235 families and 571 individuals were served by the food pantry operated out of the Crown Point Health Center.
- 8,522 lbs of food were given out.

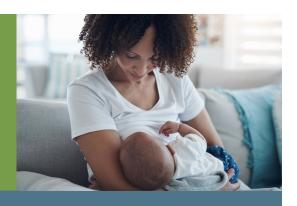

PROMOTE WELL-BEING

GOAL: Promotion of Well-being and Prevention of Mental and Substance Use Disorders

Objectives: Increase awareness and access to care for those suffering with mental health issues

Accomplishments to highlight:

• Offered the second annual Mental Health Fair in partnership with key agency and community partners.

PREVENT MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS

- Narcan kits are available for distribution from ECH emergency departments in Elizabethtown and Ticonderoga, free of charge to patients and community members.
- Pharmacy staff hosted quarterly opioid stewardship meetings to promote and encourage prescriber education and familiarity with opioid prescribing
- Newly created position of Narcotics RN at our primary care health centers is working to ensure management of narcotics through policy and education.
